What is an English Camp?

An English camp is an English language summer school course for children and teenagers aged 6-18 years old. Our courses typically run at the beginning or the end of European school summer holidays, and they usually take place in schools that are familiar to the students. Most courses run in Italy, although we do also have courses in Germany, Slovenia and France. On every camp we integrate English language lessons, art workshops, drama workshops and sports activities in a fun and exciting way, that offers every child a chance to get involved.



What we will provide:



- Travel to and from the camp from a London airport
- Full board host family accommodation.
- A competitive rate of pay
- Evenings and weekends free
- Bespoke resources and a like-minded, encouraging team.
- A chance to develop skills, and to progress into a more specialised role. It is possible to be promoted to the role of Coordinator, or Drama Coordinator.

What we need from you:

- Enthusiasm and experience working with children.
- Appropriate qualifications to teach English as a foreign language
- To be available for one or two weeks either in June, or late August/September
- Willingness to work as part of a dedicated team - a mixture of activity Leaders and teachers, led by a Coordinator
- The capability to be in sole charge of groups of up to 15 students.
- To participate in organising group activities for the whole camp, and the final performance.



What you can expect:

- Support from UK-based office, and Coordinator when at the camp, in addition to a dedicated team of colleagues.
- To be well looked after in host family accommodation.
- An opportunity to really get to know the region you work in.
- Each day at camp to be varied and interesting. The timetable outlines a variety of English Games that all take part in, in addition to a Sports Day, art workshops, and rehearsals for the Final Performance.
- To be well equipped with bespoke resources, and all necessary art and sports materials. The course runs with a thematic structure, that includes daily topics, and language focuses.
 - A sense of achievement at the end of the course, with students participating in a Final Performance.
 - To gain further opportunities with experience; the more camps that you complete with successful feedback, the more work you will be offered. There are also opportunities for promotion for experienced, returning members of staff.

Overview of an English Camp

- Staff travel and arrive on the Saturday and are welcomed by the host family, ready to begin camp on the Monday.
- Staff attend a pre-camp meeting. This is an opportunity to meet the team, the Co-ordinator and get everything ready.
- School day runs either 8.30am-4.00pm or 9.00am-4.30pm. Monday - Friday. Staff attend a team meeting for half an hour after school has finished. There are no weekend responsibilities.
- Following the timetable provided, students receive 2 English and 2 activity sessions per day, with 2 breaks and a lunch time. Camp wide activities are also timetabled several times a week.
- All lesson and activities are planned in working hours, using bespoke resources and guidance. No student should be left unattended, so break times are also supervised by staff.
- Each student completes the course with a report, project work and takes part in a Final Performance with an invited audience of family and friends.
